Included with this Newsletter is a body of work by Mr Vivian Parry of Pwllgloyw outlining his researches into the Upper Chapel War Memorial, the soldiers named there on, and their personal histories. He is keen to know if any in the Community can add more to what is known, perhaps even anecdotally, about the men who died to ensure our freedom.
